

### Supply List

Material: Unbleached muslin, scraps for dress.

Hair - Any red fuzzy yarn.

Embroidery Thread: Black, brown #801, red #221, thread that matches dresses, off white or natural, & thread that matches hair.

Paint - Barnyard Red

5 inch doll needle

Stuffing

Mechanical Pencil/disappearing fabric pen

cheesecloth

For Staining - instant coffee, vanilla extract, fragrance oil.

Sponge brush & Stencil Brush

Paper towels and paper plates

Stencil brush

Basic sewing supplies

Light box or sunny window (for pillow)

Black seed beads (for pillow)

Optional - old cookie sheet, glass jar with lid, wax paper, pliers, long beading needle (see #1 of face instructions). Glass jar with lid (for whitewashing legs).

## Annie Bowl Fillers

Approximately 8 inches tall.

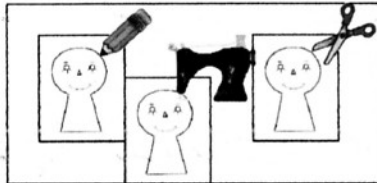
Read through all directions before beginning.

### Instructions:

#### Body:

#1. Print out all pattern pieces. I recommend printing them out on card stock. This makes the pattern easier to trace around and to save. Store the card stock pieces along with the printed out instructions in a zip lock bag, label it and its all ready for the next time you need it.



#2. On doubled muslin, trace around body pattern. Sew on traced lines being sure to leave open where indicated on pattern. Cut out about 1/4 inch from sewn lines and turn.

#3. Stuff firmly and sew opening closed.

#### Stain:

#1. Mix stain solution; in a glass jar with lid combine 1/4 cup instant coffee with 1 cup hot water. Add 2 teaspoons vanilla extract and 1/4 teaspoon fragrance oil. Shake to mix. If you want your stain mixture more fragrant, simply add more fragrance oil. Pour into a spray bottle or use sponge brush.

#2. Line an old cookie sheet with either wax paper or old rags.

#3. Spray body being sure she is completely covered; front and back.

#4. Set oven to 200 and bake for 10 minutes. NEVER LEAVE THIS UNATTENDED. If you need to bake longer, bake at 5 minute increments.

#### Face:

#1. Eyes: Thread your doll needle with a double strand of black embroidery floss. Position your black beads for eyes where you want them. Going in from the top of the dolls head (this will be covered with her hair), sew on the eyes.

#2. Mouth: Cut out your card stock printed off mouth pattern and position where you want it on the doll's face; pin there with straight pins. Position your mechanical pencil on side of mouth at the point where the line (in the center) is bolded. Trace the mouth from that point, down and around bottom of mouth and back up the other side to the same bolded line. Your mouth is now traced and ready to be embroidered. Using the same technique as above in step #1, thread your doll needle with one strand of your brown embroidery floss and go down to the mouth. At this point, I usually unthread my doll needle and rethread the floss on a smaller embroidery needle. This makes it easier to stay in the lines. Embroider the mouth with a backstitch.

#3. Eyebrows: The eyebrows are 1/2 inch long. Looking at the picture for placement, use a ruler and mark the eyebrows once again using your mechanical pencil. Rethread brown floss back on your doll needle and go up and embroider the eyebrows.

#4. Nose: Using the same technique, position the nose. Thread a double strand of red embroidery thread on your doll needle, and as in the above step, embroider the nose in a satin stitch. Once again it might be easier to unthread your doll needle when you get down to the nose and rethread on a smaller embroidery needle.

**Hair:**

- #1. Cut a small strip of yarn about 4 inches long. Thread this on a wide eyed needle, and insert into the 3 places on head as indicated on pattern. Do not tie these, but leave them lying open.
- #2. Making Hair Bunch: Using hair card, wrap yarn around 5 times and cut off at bottom. Slide this off of the hair card and center in one of the yarn strips you have inserted in head. Tie the hair bunch tightly to the head with the yarn strip. Do the same for each of the 3 places indicated on head.
- #3. Cut the loops and trim.

**Bow:**

- #1. Tear 6 small strips of cheesecloth (3 for hair bows and 3 for tags) about 10 inches long.
- #2. Stain cheesecloth as above setting the oven at 200 degrees for 5 minutes.
- #2. Tie in bow and position on head where you desire and hot glue.

**Dress:**

- #1. Trace dress pattern on wrong side of double material. Sew on traced lines leaving open where indicated. Cut out about 1/4 inch from sewn lines. Turn and press.
- #2. Place on doll and with matching embroidery floss, hand sew a running stitch completely around neck. Pull to gather and tie off in back.

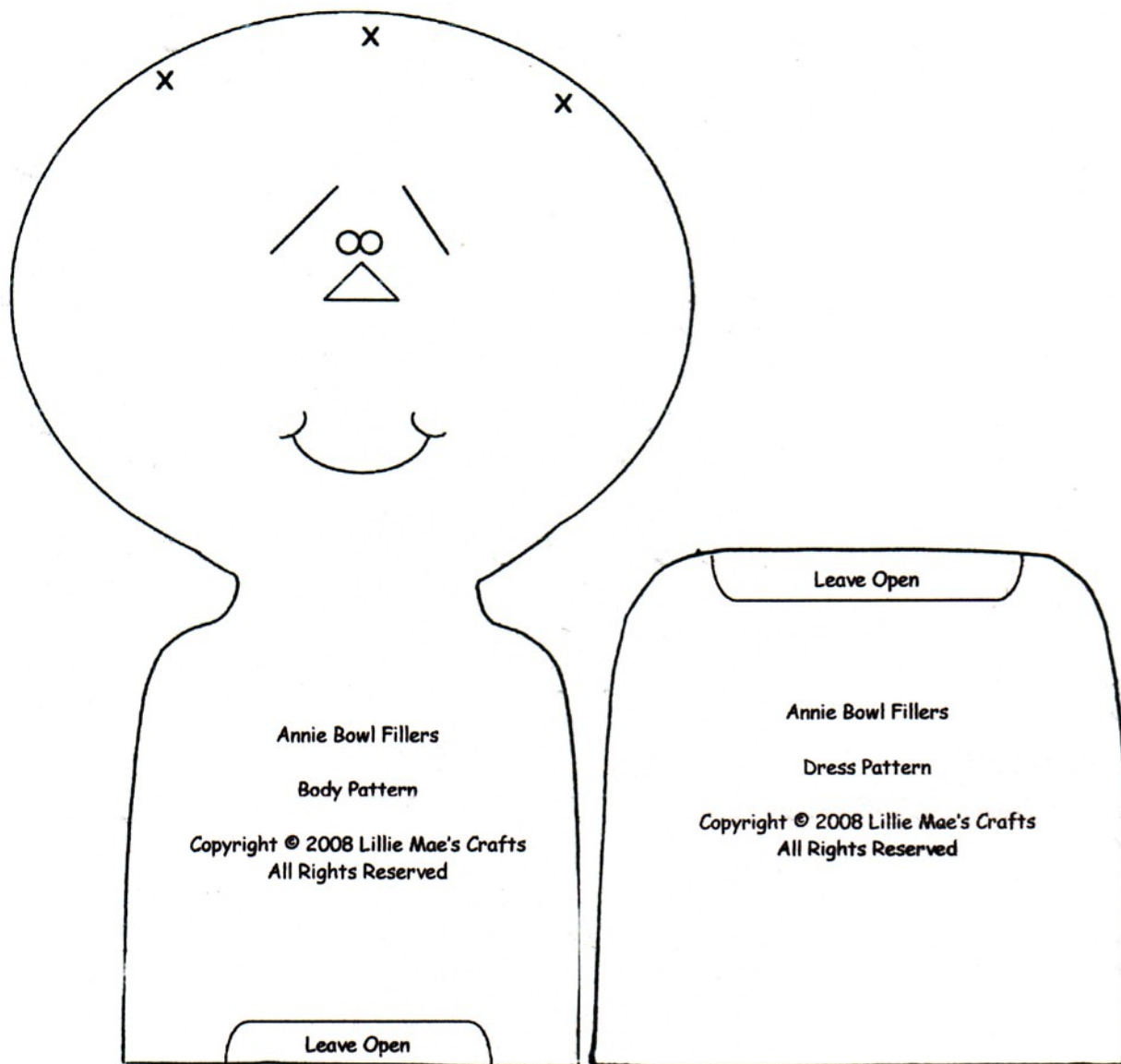
**Tag:**

- #1. Print page of tags out on card stock.
- #2. Using same stain mixture and same technique as above, spray all of the tags being sure they are all completely covered.
- #3. Set oven for 200 degrees and back for 5 minutes. NEVER LEAVE UNATTENDED. If you need to bake longer, back only at 5 minute increments.
- #4. Once they are dry, choose the 3 you like the best and cut those out. Punch out hole and attach to the front of Annie's dress with one of the pieces of cheesecloth.

#### Facial Features

**Nose:** Print and cut out pattern. Position on face where desired and attach to doll head with straight pins. Trace around pattern with mechanical pencil or disappearing fabric pen.

**Mouth:** Print and cut out pattern on cardstock. Position on face where desired and attach to doll head with straight pins. Lightly trace with pencil or disappearing fabric pen the very bottom curve of the attached mouth and up the sides to the point of the bolded middle line printed on the mouth pattern. For the sides of the mouth (dimples), line up the sides of the printed out mouth pattern where you would like the curves to go and again trace.
