

# Annie Pin Keep Pincushion Doll

Approximately 10 inches tall

## Supply List

- Muslin
  - Material for bodice and skirt
  - Card stock
  - Stuffing
  - Doll needle 3 to 5 inches
  - Cheesecloth
  - Kitty litter
  - Tiny thread spools
  - Vintage thread (to hand-thread onto the tiny thread spools) in yellow, red, and green.
  - Jute
  - Tacky glue
  - Hot glue gun and glue sticks
  - Red sport weight yarn (for hair)
  - Apple Red paint (Cheeks)
  - Muslin bag (optional – can make one with pattern which is included)
  - Sewing misc for pockets – in picture vintage scissors and measuring tape, large head colorful straight pins
  - Staining:** Instant coffee, vanilla extract, fragrance oil, sponge brush or spray bottle. Optional for staining: Old cookie sheet, rags, wax paper, glass jar with lid.

**Annie Pin Keep Pincushion Doll**

Approximately 10 inches tall.

Read through all directions before beginning.

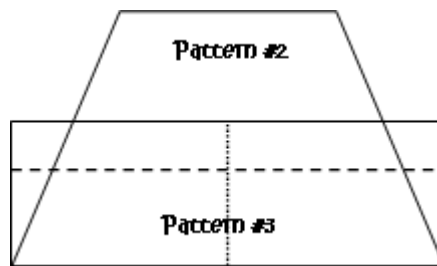
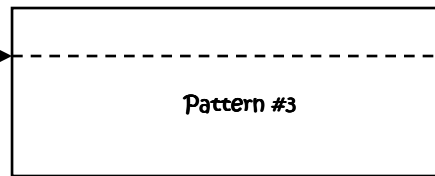
**Head:**

- #1. Print out head pattern and trace with mechanical pencil on double muslin, cut out.
- #2. Sew completely around head and neck using 1/4 inch seam allowance, being sure to leave open where indicated on pattern.
- #3. Cut out about 1/4 inch away from sewn lines and turn.
- #4. Stuff firmly, being sure to stuff neck very firmly. Sew opening shut.

**Body:**

- #1. Print out all 3 body patterns.
- #2. On double muslin, trace head pattern with mechanical pencil, cut out.
- #3. On double material, trace patterns 2 and 3, cut out.
- #4. Patterns 2 and 3 only –

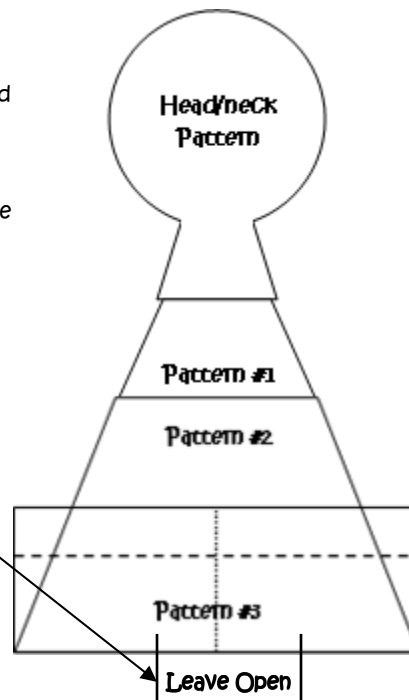
- a. Pattern 3 only – turn down one side – 1 inch
  - b. Do this for both.
  - c. Press so this stays down
  - d. Place pattern 2 behind this and pin – being sure that the turned down edges are on the inside – towards pattern #2.
  - e. measure the very center of pattern 3 and mark this with a mechanical pencil.
  - f. Sew on this line. (This divides the pocket into two sides as well as attaching pattern 3 to pattern #2)
- This is how it will look –



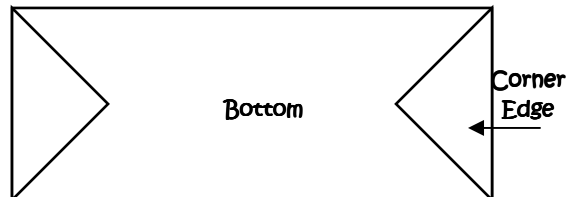
Turned down edges are on the inside of this. This hides those raw edges.

- #5. Layer for sewing pieces together.

- a. Place right sides of head/neck with pattern piece #1 and pin together
- b. Pin the sewn together pieces (above) to piece #1 with the pocket on the outside (facing towards you).
- c. Sew these edges together so now you have one complete piece.
- d. Do this for both the front and the back of the doll.
- e. Leave open as indicated on bottom for stuffing. Turn.
- f. Trim excess edges.

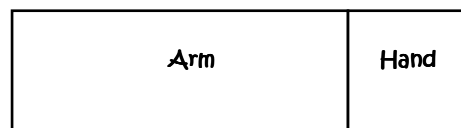


- #6. Stuff head and neck firmly...being sure to stuff the neck VERY firmly.
- #7. If you have a bought muslin bag then skip this step. Print out the muslin bag pattern and trace on double layer muslin, cut out. Using 1/4 inch seam allowance, sew 3 sides of the bag, leaving open where indicated on pattern. Fill this with Kitty litter and sew opening shut.
- #8. Stuff the body firmly leaving enough room for the muslin bag filled with Kitty litter. Place this inside and sew opening shut.
- #9. Turn corner edges of bottom in towards each other, about an inch, to enable your Annie Pin Keep Pincushion Doll to stand. The bottom will look something like this – Hand sew these edges down.

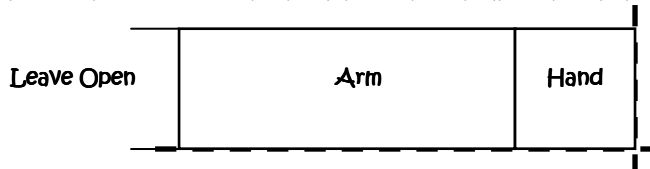


### Arms/Hands

1. Print out hand and arm pattern and trace on double material being sure to place on fold where indicated on pattern.
- #2. Place right sides together of one arm and one hand and sew using 1/4 inch seam allowance.



- #3. Fold over and sew side seam and hand seam – as illustrated below, leaving open where indicated.



- #4. Turn and stuff hand only, sew opening closed.
- #5. Position this where indicated on pattern and hand sew arms on.
- #6. Stain using the instructions given at the end of these directions.

### Face:

- #1. Eyes: Position buttons where desired. Thread your doll needle with black thread and going in from the top of her head (this will be covered with her hair) sew on the buttons for her eyes.
- #2. Mouth & Dimples: Thread your doll needle with 2 strands of your brown embroidery thread. Going in at the very top of her head (this will be covered up with her hair) embroider the mouth using a simple backstitch.
- #3. Nose: Print and cut out nose pattern. Position on face and pin using straight pins. Very lightly trace around this with a mechanical pencil. Using a double strand of red embroidery thread go in from the top of the head (as in step #2), use satin stitch for the nose; don't make an effort to make the stitches too close together as you want her nose to have a sparse look as if from years of wear and tear. If unsure of the satin stitch, visit my 'Stitch 'n' Stuff' page for an illustration. Tip - I usually unthread my doll needle here and rethread on a smaller, sharper needle. Do the same for her dimples.
- #4. Eyebrows: With a mechanical pencil and a plastic or wooden ruler (using the picture as a pattern), trace a line for the eyebrows (which are each 1/4 inch long). Thread your doll needle with a double strand of brown embroidery thread and embroider using the same technique as above.
- #5. Cheeks: Dip your medium size stencil brush lightly into Apple Red paint and pounce off most of it onto a paper towel. Using the picture for placement, swirl in her cheeks.

### Hair:

1. Cut 3 pieces of red yarn about 4 inches long and attach to head in the places indicated on pattern. Leave these pieces lying open.

2. Wrap red sport weight yarn around bang hair Card 10 times. Slide off and tie in center, place in the center of the thread that you placed at the very top center of her head, do not tie yet.
3. Cut 50 pieces of red sport weight yarn 12 inches long. Lay these on top of her head in between the 3 pieces of yarn and tie tightly, being sure to tie bangs along with this bunch of hair.
4. This is 4-ply yarn, unravel each thread for the fuzzy curly effect. Trim. Fan out bangs.

#### **Finishing:**

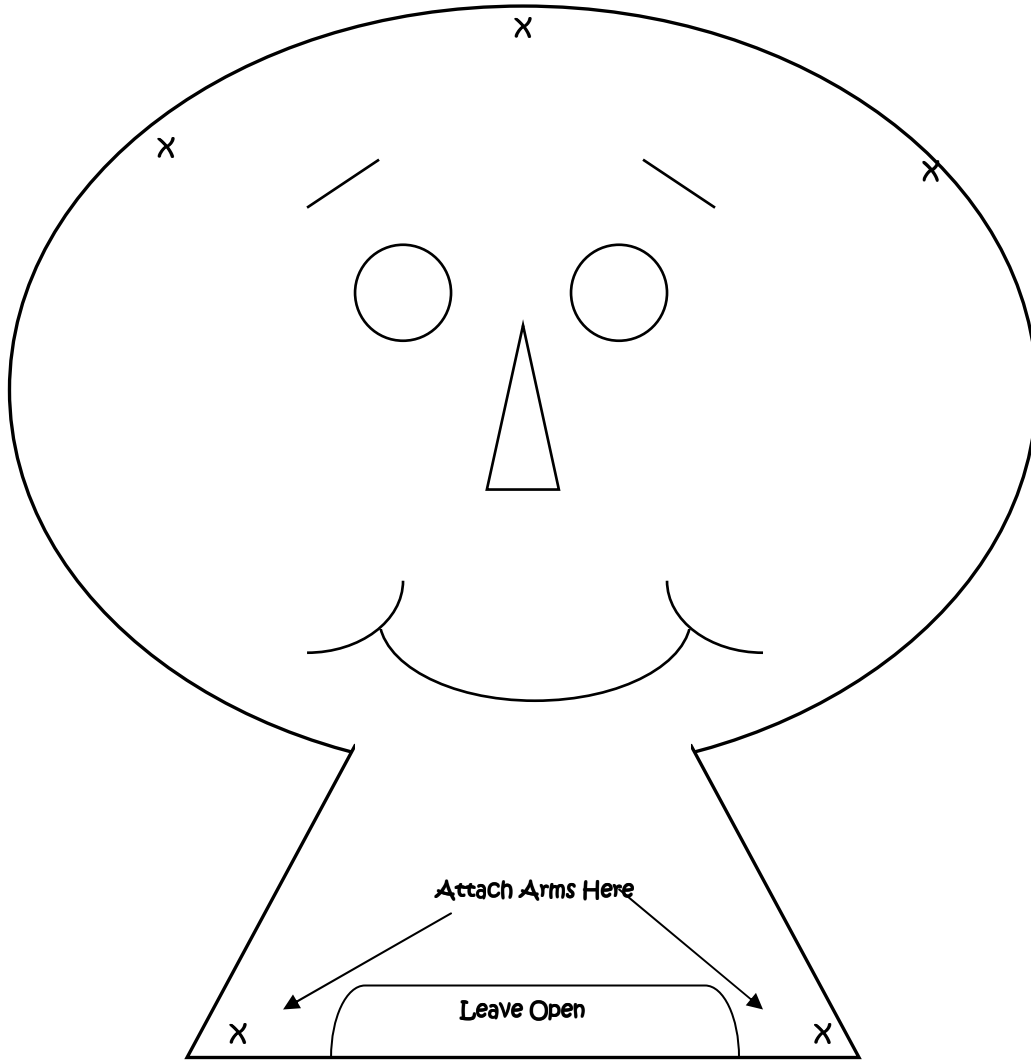
1. Measure completely around her shoulders and cut a piece of cheesecloth this length. Stain with instructions given below. Hot glue around her shoulders, being sure to cover where her arms were sewn on.
2. Wind green, yellow, and red thread onto tiny thread spools. Glue final piece of thread with a dot of tacky glue. Cut a piece of jute 6 inches long and thread these spools onto it. Hot glue to the underside of her hands.
3. Print out hair bow patterns and trace two of these on single layer material. Fashion into bows and hot glue to her pigtailed.

**Staining:** Combine ¼ cup instant coffee, 2 cups hot water, 1/4 cup Vanilla extract and ¼ teaspoon fragrance oil (Some of my preferred scents are Cinnamon bun, sugar cookies, and Vanilla) in a glass jar with lid. Shake for few minutes until thoroughly mixed. If the scent is not strong enough for your preference, add another 1/8 teaspoon of fragrance oil and continue this until the scent is to your liking. However, I would suggest only adding 1/8 teaspoon of fragrance oil each time because if you add too much and the scent is too strong for you, you will have to start over. Line an old cookie sheet with old rags and lay what you're staining here. With a sponge brush or spray bottle thoroughly coat. Bake for 10 minutes at 250 degrees. Check often as this can catch on fire. If you have to bake longer, only bake at 5 minute increments and always KEEP checking the oven. Store left over stain mixture in glass jar with lid for your next primitive project.

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## Facial Feature Box

**Eyes:** Thread doll needle with black thread. Going in from the top of her head (this will be covered with her hair), sew on buttons for eyes.

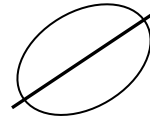
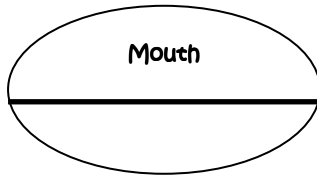
**Nose:** Print out pattern on card stock. Position on face where desired and attach to head with straight pins. Lightly trace with mechanical pencil.

**Mouth:** Print out pattern on card stock. Position on face where desired and attach to doll with straight pins. Lightly trace around the very bottom curve of the mouth going up the sides of the mouth only to the bolded lines.

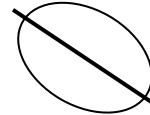
