Approximately 18 inches tall when finished.

You Will Be A Needin':

Muslin
Material
3-inch eyelet lace
Black acrylic paint
Buttons for eyes - two 1/2 inch black matte
black quilting thread
stuffing
doll needle
mechanical pencil
card stock
rubber band

For Rusting: Peroxide, white vinegar, large plastic container,
salt, paper towels.

For Staining:
Instant coffee, vanilla extract, fragrance oil
(optional)

EllaMae Teddy Bear

(Approximately 18 inches tall with hair bow)

Read through all directions before beginning.

Teddy:

1. Print and cut out all EllaMae patterns. On wrong side of double layer muslin; trace all patterns with mechanical pencil including 2 arms, 2 legs, and body; do NOT cut out. Sew on traced lines; leaving open where indicated on patterns.
2. Cut out about 1/4 inch away from sewn lines.
3. Flatten out ears and iron. Sew separation line for ears; (see pattern).
4. Stuff head and wrap a rubber band where indicated on pattern to separate head from body.
5. Stuff body and sew opening shut.
6. Stuff arms and legs to stuffing lines and sew openings shut.
7. Stain all with recipe and instructions given below and throw in dryer to dry.
8. Sew arms and legs to body where indicated on pattern.
9. Face: Eyes - position 1/2 inch matte black buttons where desired on face and pin in place with straight pins. Thread doll needle with black quilt thread and sew eyes in place.
10. Face: Snout - Print out snout pattern on card stock and cut out. Trace on double muslin; sew on traced lines...do NOT leave an opening. Cut out about 1/4 inch away from sewn lines. Cut a small slit in center of back for turning. Turn. Stuff lightly and sew opening closed. Paint black and let dry. Position on head where desired (see pattern and picture) and pin in place with straight pins. Thread doll needle with black quilt thread and sew snout in place. Take your quilting thread on down and sew 3 straight backstitch lines for mouth (see pattern) - can draw these on beforehand with mechanical pencil if desired.

Dress:

1. Print off bodice and skirt dress patterns.
2. Bodice: Place bodice on double material being sure to place on fold where indicated on pattern. Trace 2 and cut out.
3. Skirt: Place skirt pattern on double material being sure to place on fold where indicated on pattern. Cut out 2.
4. Sew a gathering stitch about $\frac{1}{4}$ inch down from top of each skirt pattern; pull to gather. Match these to bottom of both sides of bodice; pin and stitch in place.
5. Pin sides and underarms and stitch seams closed using $\frac{1}{4}$ inch seam allowance.
6. Measure around bottom of dress and cut piece of eyelet lace to fit. With right sides together, pin eyelet lace in place and sew using 1/4 inch seam allowance.
8. Place dress on doll and turn neck under $\frac{1}{4}$ inch. Hand stitch a gathering stitch all the way around, pull to gather and tie off.

Staining Instructions:

Supplies Needed:

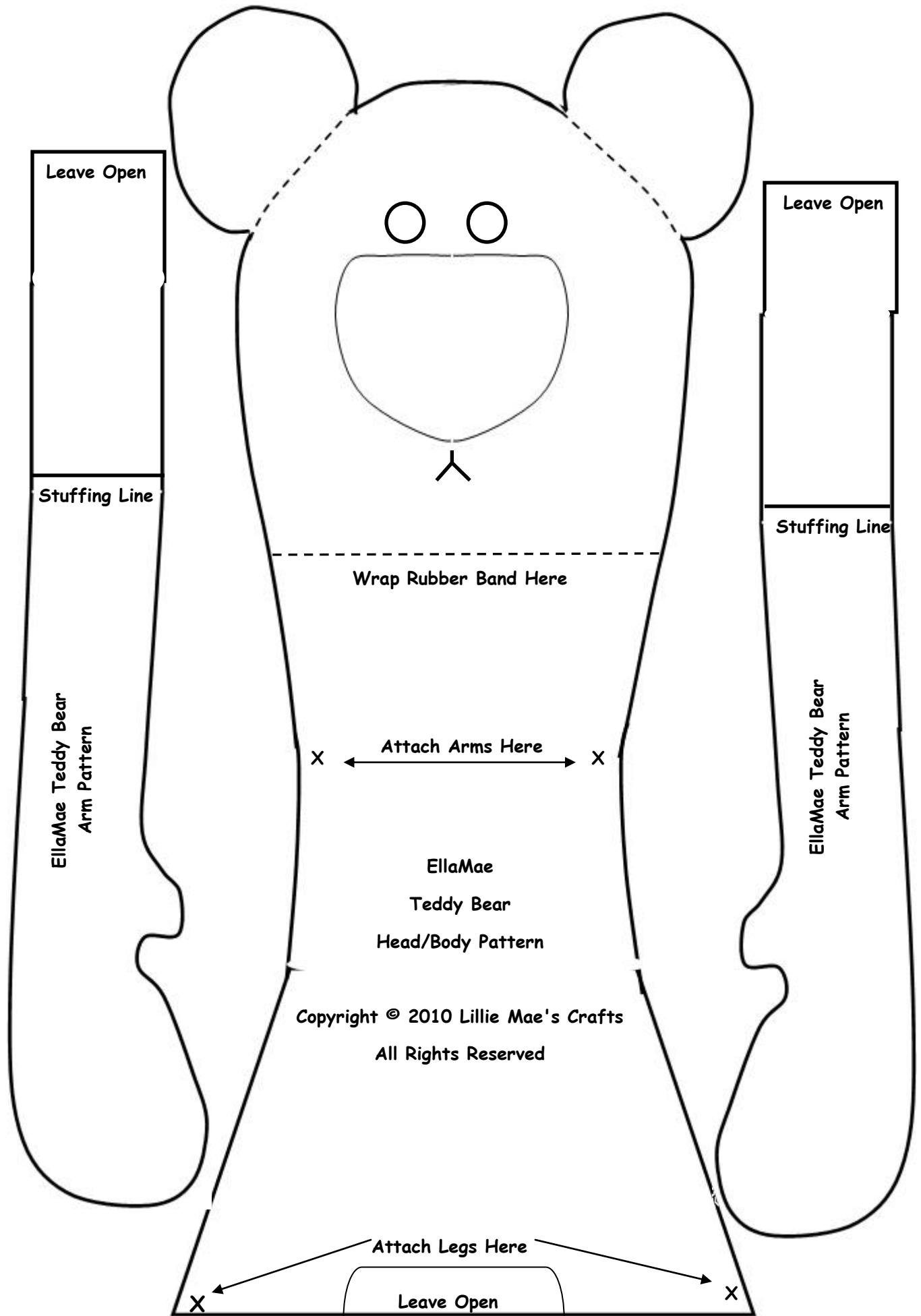
- Instant coffee
 - Vanilla extract
 - Fragrance oil (optional)
 - Old cookie sheet, wax paper, paper towels, old rags
 - Small spray bottle
 - Funnel
1. Mix together in glass jar with lid - $\frac{1}{4}$ cup instant coffee, 2 cups hot water and $\frac{1}{4}$ cup vanilla extract.
 2. Add fragrance oil to your taste. (HINT: You may want to add just a little at first and add more if you desire. If you add too much to begin with it may be stronger than you prefer.)
 3. Pour stain into spray bottle.
 4. Lay wax paper or old rags on cookie sheet. Lay here what you are staining. Spray front and back thoroughly with stain.
 5. Bake in oven at 200 degrees for 10 minutes. If you need to bake longer, only bake at 5 minute increments.
