Pretty in Pink Bunny

Read through all directions before beginning.

Instructions:

19 inches tall

Body:

1. Print out head/body, leg, and arms patterns on card stock
2. Trace around these patterns on doubled muslin with pencil, being sure to trace 2 legs, 2 arms, and 2 ears. Pin.
3. Sew on traced lines for rest of patterns, head/body pattern, arms and legs being sure to leave open where indicated. Tip: Change stitches on machine to small which helps prevent seam popping when stuffing your doll.
4. Cut around about $\frac{1}{4}$ inch from sewn lines. Tip: Cut out with pinking shears.
5. Clip curves and turn.

Ears:

1. Print out ear pattern on card stock.
2. Trace 2 ear patterns on doubled muslin.
3. Trace 2 ear patterns on single layer warm n natural.
4. Sandwich warm n natural ear pattern between muslin ear cut outs and pin.
5. Sew ears $\frac{1}{4}$ inch around entire ear pattern. Trim with pinking Shears.
6. With fingernails, scrape along edges of muslin to fray.

Face:

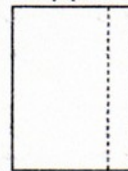
1. Print out facial features and pin to appropriate place.
2. Trace with mechanical pencil.
3. Eyes: With small paint brush, outline eyes first and then fill in. With end of small paintbrush, dip lightly in antique white paint and dot on whites of eyes (see picture or pattern for placement).
4. Whiskers: Tear from muslin 6 small strips $\frac{1}{4}$ inch wide x 2 inches long. Press. Thread doll needle with natural colored thread. Place whiskers where shown on pattern. Go in through very top of head (this will be covered with ears) sew on whiskers. Very carefully with scissors cut each whisker in half length-wise.
5. Nose: Print out nose pattern, place on single layer muslin and cut out one. With fabric glue, glue to appropriate place on face being sure to cover where whiskers have been sewn on. Allow to completely dry. Thread your doll needle with double strand of rose embroidery floss and, using the same method as for whiskers, go in from top of head and down to bottom of nose. Unthread your doll needle and rethread floss on small embroidery needle. Embroidery the nose, going from outside of the muslin nose pattern just glued on, using satin stitch technique.
6. Eyebrows & Mouth: Thread one strand of brown embroidery floss on doll needle and, using same technique as above, go down to beginning of nose and using one straight stitch for each 3 stitches, stitch mouth. Go up to eyebrows and with one stitch each stitch them. Go back out through top of head and tie off and knot.

Dress:

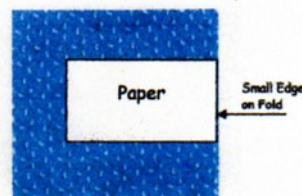
1. Print out bodice pattern.
2. On doubled bodice fabric, trace pattern being sure to place on fold where indicated on pattern. Cut 2.
3. For skirt pattern, take a plain sheet of paper and tear or cut $\frac{1}{4}$ of the paper (lengthwise) away. It is the larger portion that is used for the skirt pattern.
4. Place this portion on doubled layer of material with small edge on fold. Cut two of these. Turn under $\frac{1}{4}$ inch and hem (this is done before attaching to bodice).

Using 8-1/2 x 11 Sheet of Paper for Skirt Pattern

1. Tear or cut $\frac{1}{4}$ of the paper lengthwise away.

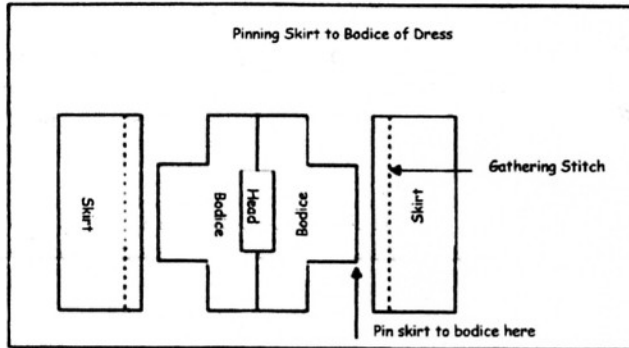


2. The largest part ($\frac{3}{4}$ of the paper) is used for the skirt pattern.
3. Place on doubled layer of material with small edge of paper on fold.



4. Cut 2.

5. Cut one piece of lace the same size and place on top of this piece of material. (Do this for both pieces of skirt).
6. Doing front and back separately, take one piece of the cut out skirt and lace and sew a gathering or a running stitch about 1/4" away from one long edge. Gather that part of the skirt and with right sides together match it to the bottom of the bodice. Pin & sew right above the gathering stitch.
7. Do the same for the other side of the bodice.
8. With right sides together, match up the front and back dress pieces and, using 1/4 inch seam allowance, sew together. Turn hem under 1/4 inch and hem. Turn bottom of sleeves up about 1/4 inch and hand sew.



embroidery thread, run a gather stitch around. Pull to gather. Run a gathering stitch around waistline and pull to gather.

Hair Bow:

1. Tear piece of muslin 2 inches wide by 20 inches long, tie in bow and glue to top of head, slightly off center with tails hanging and covering where ears were attached.

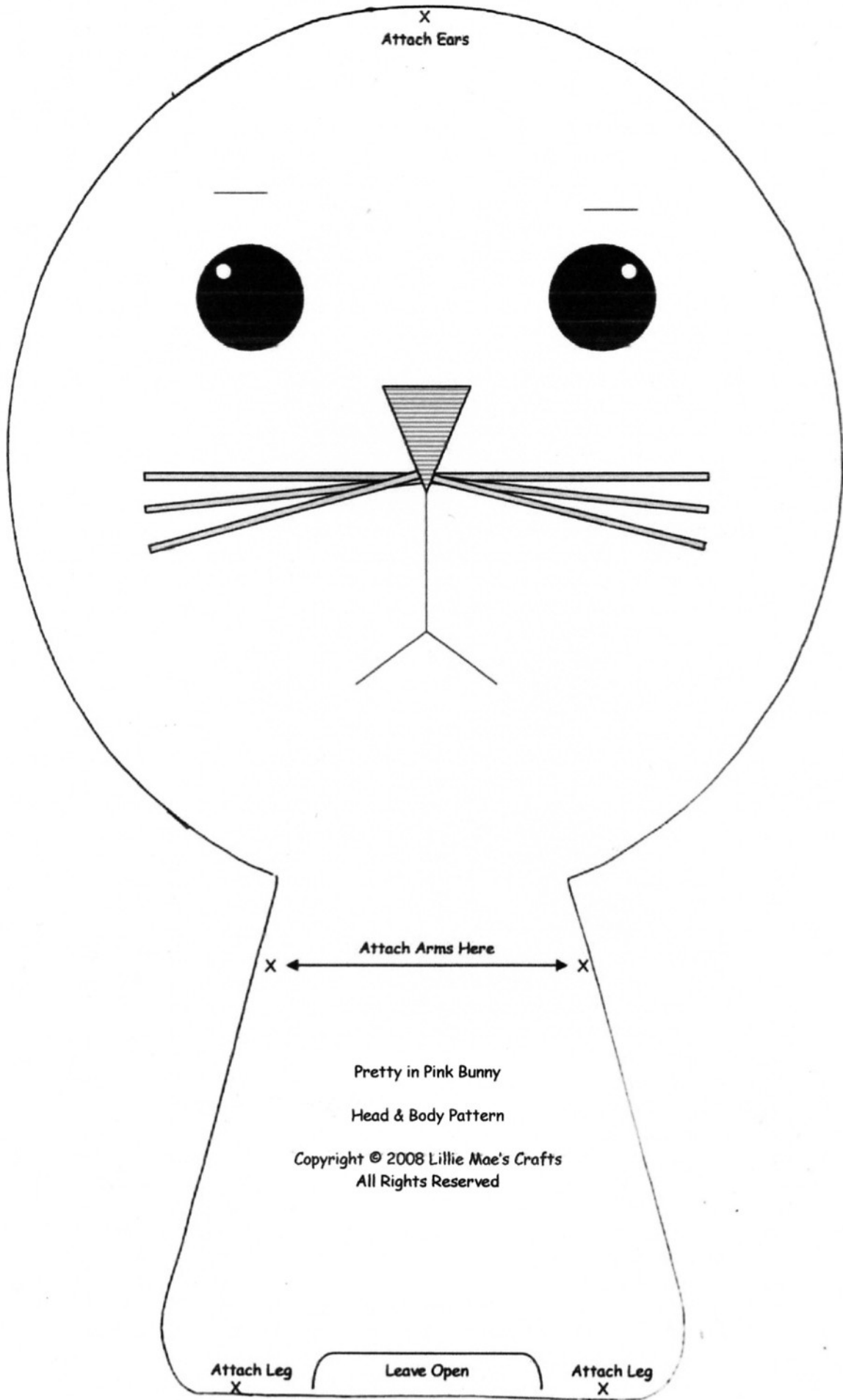
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9. Tear piece of muslin 1 inch wide by 16 inches long, tie in bow and hot glue to front of dress right below neckline.

Pantaloons/Bloomers:

1. Print and cut out pantaloon pattern. On doubled unbleached muslin, trace pattern with mechanical pencil.
2. Sew on traced lines, outside as well as inside seams. Cut out about 1/4 inch from sewn lines. Clip curves and turn. Turn waistline down 1/4 inch and hem.
3. Trim bottom of legs with pinking shears. One inch up from bottom of each leg, with matching
